Summer and Fall Happenings

Pilot Program Helps Pre-Schoolers Successfully Transition to Kindergarten

This past summer, St. Michael's piloted our first successful Kindergarten Readiness Program, also known as K Camp, to prepare our Pre-K students for a successful transition to kindergarten. We combined our Pre-K classrooms for structured learning activities, meal times and fun early literacy and STEAM-themed field trips.

Summer Camp days included:

- Mock kindergarten classes getting children ready for larger classes and new
- Walking trips to the Wilmington Public Library and Reading on Rodney Square
- · Language and Literacy, Math, Science, Arts, Movement and Music activities
- A field trip to Hagley Museum to learn about Summer in Industrial America
- An elementary school tour, highlighting several schools our children moved on to in the fall
- Building social and emotional skills that are so important for positive interaction with new peers
- A free experience to participants and funded entirely by St. Michael's. Plans are to continue K Camp every summer!




Outdoor Classroom Expands Curriculum

Thanks to funding through the Delaware Community Needs Grant opportunity, a program under the COVID-19 Strategic Response Fund at the Delaware Community Foundation, St. Michael's added a beautiful outdoor classroom. This summer and fall, we used the space



to teach children to plant sunflower gardens, observe the busy lives of ants in our ant farm and have hands-on activities with our wiggly worm friends, just to name a few. Our Outdoor Classroom Curriculum Coordinators create age appropriate lessons so all children can be engaged in outdoor learning year-round.

The Let's Go Outside grant from the University of DE also allowed our teachers and administrators to receive several hours of professional development training. We are now a certified outdoor learning space facility!

The campaign, Committed to the Future of our Community: St. Michael's Renovation and Expansion Project, seeks to raise a total of \$6.4 million for critically needed renovations and upgrades to our aging buildings and to replace systems that are beyond their life expectancie. It also includes new building additions to provide for increased enrollment and curriculum as well as expanded services to the East Side community.

Renovations are underway and will continue through November 2023, with the project being completed in phases so services to families can continue throughout the renovations. To date, about \$2.8 million has been raised through foundations, government and individuals.

Meet Our Family Engagement Team

Ashlinn Lorenzana, Community & Family Outreach Coordinator

As Community and Family Outreach Coordinator, Ashlinn (*pictured left below*) is often the first contact for families when they are exploring enrollment of their child. Her responsibilities include providing onboarding procedures, family orientations, school tours and general



school information, coordinating the Family Resource Room and referring families to community and state resources.

A St. Michael's alum and parent of two girls who currently attend the school,

Ashlinn is a strong ambassador for families. While pursuing her Masters in Human Services, she started her career at St. Michael's as an intern working with two year olds before becoming an employee and then transitioning into administration in her current role.

Ashlinn was instrumental in helping to reconfigure the enrollment pattern of St. Michaels when the school expanded its Infant and Toddler Program several years ago to better meet the city's need for more infant programs. Families who enroll their infants often remain with us through their child's foundational first five years of life. As our Pre-K families prepare to transition to kindergarten, Ashlinn helps them navigate Delaware's school choice program, working to simplify what can often be an overwhelming process for parents. Since becoming a parent, Ashlinn says her desire to help all families access a quality early education for their children has strengthened.

Erica Antoine, Family Support Specialist

As the Family Support Specialist, Erica meets with families after they have completed a Family Needs Assessment and provides information about local support services and resources to address their social determinants of health. Erica makes it her mission to build trust with families over time in order to strengthen the entire family unit. She believes that the family is their child's first teacher and that children need strong support systems and stability to thrive. She works to ensure that families have the tools they need to provide this support and consistency for their children.

Originally from New York, Erica followed her interest in early childhood education to St. Michael's. She has been with the school for two years, starting as a Pre-K teacher, then the Pre-School department head before transitioning to her current role. Already, she has implemented two new initiataves for our Pre-K students: Kindergarten Academy Camp, a summer program to prepare children for a successful transition to kindergarten and a Pre-School Book Club to foster a love of books and early reading competency.



CAROLYN MARTIN-PETTIWAY ON GENERATIONAL IMPACT

Carolyn Martin-Pettiway has a passion for people and for Wilmington. She spent 43 years working for the City in various roles until she transitioned to her current position as Administrative Assistant to State Senator Elizabeth Lockman.

As a life-long resident of the City, Martin-Pettiway has a deep knowledge of its rich history, including St. Michael's history of service to the East Side. Generations of her family have attended St. Michael's and many have gone on to achieve post-secondary education and have successful careers. Her great nephew Kaden (pictured with Martin-Pettiway above) is currently a pre-schooler. She credits St. Michael's for providing numerous family members with not just a strong educational foundation, but a comfortable, safe haven over the years. "Good things happen at 7th and Walnut.", she says. "Children receive the nurturing, care and attention that they need to go on to thrive. They learn to build character, to be compassionate and to have respect for others - these are essential for success in school and life."

Martin-Pettiway sees St. Michael's as an important piece of the neighborhood revitalization in the East Side. "It's essential for St. Michael's to continue to be here to set up the next generation of young children and families for success."

Committed to the Future of Our Community

A Foundational Statement from Our Executive Director on St. Michael's Renovation and Expansion Project

Since 1890, St. Michael's has been caring for Wilmington's youngest citizens, often those in most need of services and care. It has gone through many iterations - from

daily care for the children of tannery workers to providing respite care for children whose parents were recuperating from tuberculosis. It has served as an orphanage and an adoption agency. In the 1930's, it was known as St. Michael's Hospital for Colored Babies and was the only facility in Wilmington where families of color could

find medical care for their children. With the construction of its purpose-built early childhood center in 1967, St. Michael's joined others in the field of early education to enrich the daily educational experiences of the children and to ready them for kindergarten and a successful entry into formal education. In the last decade, it has expanded the Infant and Toddler programs to answer not only the needs of working families but also to build a strong community to benefit families with various means of support. Our families often need help as they navigate social services, developmental and medical

issues of their children, kindergarten choice and registration, and various other challenges which call for advocacy and knowledge of systems. As St. Michael's looks at its next iteration and the needs of the present population, commitment to young families' needs becomes intertwined with the

commitment to the education and care of young children as they are interlocked in any

system offering hope.

Along with this renewed commitment is a frank recognition of the work force crisis facing the early education and care profession. It is a dire situation calling not only for immediate remediation, but also

for a long-term solution. St. Michael's has sustained its own work force throughout this pandemic and encouraged and supported professional development which will elevate wages as well as the quality of children's experiences. We work with city, state, and national resources to address and design programs to begin the repair of the early childhood profession.

The much-needed repairs and renovations of the physical plant will ensure that St. Michael's can move into this next stage of evolution. New roofs, ceilings that do not

leak, windows that are not held in place with tape will contribute to the safety and welfare of all who enter our facility. The renovation of the expansive library will include publicly shared spaces for a social worker and family resources as well as study spaces for

cohorts of teachers advancing their careers. The library will be re-designed for young children and people reading to them—teachers, parents, volunteers. Reaching 3rd grade reading level begins with a love for books and being read

to must begin in infancy. There is no advice for parents more important to prepare their child for educational success than to read to their children.

The world of poverty creates an enormous amount of noise in one's brain. Walking into a community that knows you, your child, and your family and is dedicated to your success can be the beginning of a foundation for moving beyond. St. Michael's has a long history of supporting the city of Wilmington through not one but two pandemics of that history. With those deep roots, this next iteration of St. Michael's will enrich, support and advance families in even more expansive ways. It is an exciting time to be here!
