St. Michael's School **RENOVATION AND EXPANSION PROJECT**

A \$6.7 million campaign to increase our physical and programmatic footprint

Rep. Blunt Rochester Invests Federal Funding in Capital Improvments

We are thrilled to share that St. Michael's has been awarded \$1 million in Community Project Funding through a FY24 federal appropriations bill from Congresswoman Lisa Blunt Rochester in support of our capital renovations project. In April, Rep. Blunt Rochester visited to tour the facility, see the latest construction and visit with students.

Funding was made in coordination with U.S. Senators Tom Carper and Chris Coons and will be used for building upgrades, adding new classrooms and strengthening St. Michael's role as a community resource. We are extremely grateful for the wonderful support of and collaboration with Delaware's Congressional team. With this funding. St. Michael's has now reached \$5.5 million of the \$6.7 million needed to complete construction.

Partnership with Nature Society Creates New Habitats

An exciting collaboration with the Delaware Nature Society (DNS) is introducing new natural habitats in St. Michael's 30,000 square feet of outdoor space – while also creating new teaching opportunities for our staff and children. The two entities connected last fall when a few St. Michael's staff attended a Monarch Migration event hosted by DNS at the Du Pont Environmental Education Center. Kerry Wilson, DNS' Habitat Outreach Coordinator, later visited St. Michael's to suggest ways to enhance our outdoor spaces and integrate lessons on nature and science into our curriculum.

Those initial conversations have evolved into what is now a comprehensive city-wide project to create and protect healthy habitats in Wilmington at St. Michael's and at several other schools and community organizations in the city. The project



is funded through a grant from the Delaware Watershed Conservation Fund. At St. Michael's, Wilson is working with staff to install a pollinator garden, a food garden, native trees, a bug zone with tree stumps, a woodland fairy garden with native plants and flowering vines along the fences. "We are working to normalize nature for children", she explains. "When you create safe, green infrastructures that build trust with nature, it helps children to let go of the fear of things like bugs, bees, worms and beetles and to begin to have conversations about the world around them. It's important for children to have this exposure and to understand that you can experience the impact of nature even in small, compact spaces in the city."

Wilson says St. Michael's school yard is the first in the city of its kind with several different types of habitats being layered in over time. In addition to the plantings, the DNS-led grant also provides gardening tools for students and adults, rain barrels, a compost pile and ongoing workshops and support for our staff on sustaining practices for the new habitats. Many thanks to the Nature Society for their commitment to this important and beautiful initiative at St. Michael's and across our city!
