### St. Michael's School RENOVATION AND EXPANSION PROJECT

A \$6.7 million campaign to increase our physical and programmatic footprint

### **Capital Improvements Enter Final Phase**

We are excited to share the progress that has been made as St. Michael's continues its first major capital campaign in over 20 years. Renovations began in August 2022 and have been strategically divided into multiple phases to minimize the time that each area of the facility is impacted. This has allowed for effective choreography to keep children and staff together in their class while moving to other rooms. St. Michael's has remained open and operational throughout renovations. Staff, children and families, contractors and subcontractors have been incredibly flexible and accommodating to all of the moving parts associated with such an extensive renovation project within a unique environment and facility. Guided by the goal of keeping St. Michael's open to continue serving families, all those associated with the work have remained strategic and thoughtful. We are so grateful for the collaboration and cooperation of our entire school community.


Committed to the Future of Our Community: St. Michael's Renovation and Expansion Project will:

- Address critically needed renovations and upgrades to our aging buildings, infrastructure and major systems
- Increase enrollment with 2 new pre-school classrooms
- Expand and formalize services for families and residents of the East Side neighborhood of Wilmington
- Add new admin offices and designated spaces for staff and family meetings, community programming and educational trainings
- Support pathways to early childhood education careers through mentoring and cohort opportunities



The library is temporarily converted into two pre-school classrooms as work continues throughout the facility.





Renovations are scheduled for completion in August 2024. The architectural drawing below shows the finished plan from the front facade.







During this time, St. Michael's has focused on the education and care of the youngest residents of the City of Wilmington, often those with the highest needs. It is the oldest childcare center in Delaware and one of the oldest in the nation. It has consistently responded to the changing needs of families in the City.

### **Powering Through to Finish the Construction**

And then it's December! I am not sure how that happened so quickly - although the beginning of the school year always streams into Halloween into family-teacher conferences into Thanksgiving and then into the scramble of the holiday season at high speed.

Then add the choreography of moving classrooms and teachers around the needs and logistics of the construction! The desk sign that a colleague gave me, "Chaos Coordinator", describes the days here at 700 N. Walnut Street rather precisely!

The urgency to finish the construction is undeniable—from burst pipes and malfunctioning

HVAC systems to windows held in place with electrical tape to leaking roofs and chipped flooring. This is matched with the sense of urgency to continue serving our children and their families. These both require the pressing need to meet our fundraising goal to finish the renovations on schedule by summer 2024 so we can continue our work.

I am thrilled and humbled to share that we have raised \$4 million towards the \$6.7 million needed to complete the project. The wonderful support from local foundations. government entities, current and past Board members and a core group of donors with a history of service to St. Michael's have been instrumental in helping to launch the campaign. Now, we need YOUR help to reach our goal and complete the renovations.

St. Michael's has stayed open during con-

struction and our families have stayed with us. They understand that while safety is the first priority, the quality of the early education and care we offer must continue at a high level.

At this phase of the project, our motto has become "we not only power through;

we consistently raise the bar". Our 30,000 sq.ft. facility has always been pristine and well-equipped; the con-

struction rebuilds and strengthens the infrastructure to deepen the integrity of the facility itself. Our outdoor space, also almost

**WE CONSISTENTLY** 30,000 sq.ft., not only offers our children places

to run, jump, swing, and slide, but also now has an outdoor classroom and is a certified outdoor learning space. Outdoor curriculum coordinators work with every class weekly, introducing children to the wonders and science of nature so our children have the opportunity to experience nature at its urban best.

St. Michael's continues to attract educators who are lifelong learners. Even during the pandemic, members of our staff achieved their Child Development Associate (CDA) certification, an internationally recognized credential soon to be the baseline in Delaware. Presently, we have 10 staff in that pipeline. We also have two trained and certified CDA coaches on staff to guide and support the

I am very proud of all that our staff have

accomplished over the last few years. The pandemic challenged us in historic fashion, but we consistently answered those challenges with the practice of holding the highest standards of best practice for our profession. We have welcomed the addition of Head Start and other state-funded programs. These programs commit us to a significant increase in the supports and guidance we offer our
